There's a Right Time for Everything

3 There's an opportune time to do things, a right time for everything on the earth:

A right time for birth and another for death,

A right time to destroy and another to construct,

A right time to cry and another to laugh,

A right time to lament and another to cheer,

A right time to make love and another to abstain,

The Litany of Remembrance

First Candle- We light this candle to remember those whom we have loved and lost, to remember them clearly, their faces, their voices, their bodies, their love. We embrace and give thanks for the memories that bind us together yet still in this season of expectation, when all Creation waits for the Light. We remember them with love. May God's eternal love surround them and us, always.

Second Candle- We light this candle to remember the pain of loss, of relationships, of trust, of jobs, of health, of faith, the loss of joy. We acknowledge and embrace the pain of the past, loving God, and we offer it all to you, asking you into our wounded hearts and open our hands to You to place in them, the gifts of your love and shalom, your peace. We remember that through You, all things are possible. Refresh, restore, renew us, O God, and lead us into Your Love and future.

The Third Candle- We light this candle to pause and reflect upon the past week, months, years, that have been heavy for us and upon us as burdens. We accept and lay before you, the sharpness of memory, the sadness and grief, the hurt and fear, the anger and pain. We accept and lay before you the ways we feel we have fallen short, the times we've spent blaming ourselves, others and you. We have all suffered. We accept and lay before you the time we have walked alone, in darkness and in the knowledge of our own finitude. We remember that though we have journeyed far, and that

while lost, we may have turned away from your Light, which has not failed to shine upon us. We remember that though winter has come, the nights lengthened, we know the dawn will come and defeat the darkness.

The Fourth Candle- We light this candle to remember our faith, that gift of light and hope which you O God offer to us in the stories we often hear and/or remember. We remember that you our Loving God keep the light shining in us, just as in the Temple in days of old, and for Jesus, the light of the world who came to share this life with us, who promises us comfort and peace. We remember the One who shares our burdens, who shows us the way to your Light and who journeys with us into all of our tomorrows.
