

Synopsis of December 2023 Session Meeting

- Session approved the use of Bonham Hall on Thursdays from 1 3:30 PM for members to work on crafts.
- Session approved changing the hours and days of work for the Church's Administrative Assistant, effective January 1st. As a result, the Church Office will be open Monday Thursday only.
- The Worship Committee is in discussion with Greenwich Presbyterian for a joint Ash Wednesday worship service in February 2024.
- Session approved the celebration of Communion on January 14, 2024 when new officers for the church boards will be ordained/installed.
- Session approved the local and regional mission allocations recommended by the
 Mission Committee for the balance of 2023. These included local allocations for St.
 Vincent DePaul/St. Teresa's Parish of the Holy Cross, Trinity First Hope Center
 (Millville) for their Food Program, Bridgeton Municipal Alliance, Bet-El, and FPC
 Bridgeton Deacons to assist their local giving. Regional allocations included Habitat
 for Humanity in Appalachia, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, TN,
 and PCUSA (Presbyterian Giving Catalog) for Education grants/gifts.
