






Synopsis of May 2023 Session Meeting

- 1. Session will be updating the Sexual Abuse and Child Protection policy of the Church to bring it up to date with the recent changes made with the Presbytery policy. Rev. Kaul will be providing training on safe sanctuary practices to members of our boards and Sunday School teachers.
- 2. The formal addition of a Technology Committee for Session was approved.
- 3. Installation of the Church's new sound system is tentatively scheduled for August 7th with construction of a booth for the sound system in the back of the Church along with installation of the necessary electrical work is to be completed prior to this date.
- 4. Progress with converting information from our existing Church web site to our new site is being made. Any changes necessary to access this site will be announced once completed. Work on the development of our live service broadcasting will begin soon once the new web site is in place with tentative plans for completion in September.
- 5. Session approved the content of an Emergency Contact Information form which will be used to contact a personal reference should anyone experience an emergency while at Church. This form will be introduced to the Congregation and placed into use in the near future.



After Lent, Holy Week, the 40 days following Easter, and Pentecost, we'll be entering "Ordinary Time". We're not sure what "ordinary" or "normal" is anymore, but hopefully, your normal includes weekly worship.

June 4th, Trinity Sunday, our service will include communion. June 11th will be our last Sunday worshipping in the Sanctuary. June 18th worship will be held in Bonham Hall prior to our annual church picnic.

We will continue to worship in Bonham Hall the rest of June and through July. In August, worship will be held at the Old Broad Street Church.



Revelings Summer 2023

As Spring gives way to summer, there always seems to be a "shift" in priorities, of tasks/work to be done. Perhaps we're appreciating the gift of "more time" being presented to us. It seems that church life tends to "slow down" a little bit. We perhaps find time to "rest" as God intended us to do so.

Summertime as I'm soon to appreciate, is celebrated/experienced far differently here in So. NJ, than it can be/is back in the Midwest, where I grew up. I'm looking forward to learning what this season is like here. Some scriptures can help us to reflect upon God, who God is, what God can be/is like for us, during this season called "summer."

The graphics for this Revelings reflect this. They also represent what my "old" and "new" ways of celebrating Summer have been, and now are. Yes, there are similarities here in Southern NJ, farmstands, crops growing etc.

My old ways/experiences: On the Great Plains one finds mostly corn, soybeans, sunflowers and wheat growing, with low humidity/100-degree temperatures. In Southern MO, Eastern AR, Western TN, Northern MS, it's many fields of cotton "white gold" growing, hot and humid! In Middle and Northern MO, there's lots of soybeans and corn growing, lots of humidity and temps in 90's-100 degrees.



In MO, most everyone goes to "the Lake." This can mean either the "Lake of the Ozarks," (in Mid-MO) or "Bull Shoals," or "Tablerock" (in SW MO). In MI, most everyone goes "up north"/ "the cottage," meaning

close to the U.P., the Upper Peninsula, or over to "Grand Traverse." The folks mean, either going to Mackinac Island (pronounced, Mackinaw), or along the shores of the Great Lakes, Superior, Huron, Erie Shores (Put In Bay OH) or Michigan (Traverse City, Muskegon taking the ferry to Milwaukee WI).

In the U.P. and Northern Ontario, one deals with "black flies" that carry quite the bite, also dressing in "layers," meaning shorts, short/long sleeved shirts/tees, and a "fleece." Temps there may get into the 90"s occasionally, but it's mostly mild and not much humidity. Fireworks over the lake on July 4th, that's the quintessential "northern summer."



In St. Louis, (MO), there's nothing like watching the fireworks on July 4^{th} , along the banks of the Mississippi River, lying on the grass under the Gateway Arch, watching them go forth into the sky from the barge in the middle of the river... oh it's awesome.





My "New" ways: Here in Southern NJ, I've learned, one goes "to the shore" (along the Atlantic Ocean) or "to the bay" (the Delaware Bay). I look forward to spending some time reading along the shores of both of these this summer. I was gifted a novel "The Book of Lost Names" to read, it's now on my "to read list." I hope that many of us will be able to find the time to pick up a good read or two, including some scriptures and devotional books during these next months.

After a very "full" first 5 months of our work together, as pastor and people, from January through May, (a great thing), the summer months present us with time to catch our breath. The Holy Spirit is keeping us busy!

For this we give thanks to God!


